An application for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Panskura Police Station Case No.558 of 2025 dated 18.06.2025 under Sections 109/115(2)/117(2)/118(2)/3(5)/324(4)/319(4)/351(2)/74 of the BNS.

Heard learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that there was free fight between neighbours over the issue of parking of motorcycles. Both sides suffered injuries. There were case and counter case.

Learned counsel for the State submits that the injuries suffered were not grievous.

Considering the above, the materials available in the case diary and the fact that charge-sheet has been submitted, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on the further conditions that the petitioners shall surrender before the jurisdictional court and pray for bail within four weeks from this date and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
