C.R.M. (NDPS) 1411 of 2025

In Re: An application for bail under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 filed in connection with Gangarampur Police Station Case No.472 of 2025 dated 11.07.2025 under Section 21(c)/22(c)/23(c)/27A/28/29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985;

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been arrested on the basis of statement of co accused, from whom 300 bottles of phensegrip were recovered. Learned advocate submits that the petitioner is innocent of the charges and he may be released on bail on any stringent conditions.

On the other hand, Mr. Sengupta, learned advocate appearing for the State submits that there is another case against the present petitioner.

Be that as it may, since the petitioner is in custody for 114 days and till date there has been no recovery from the possession of the present petitioner, I am of the opinion that further detention of the petitioner is unwarranted.

Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is allowed. The petitioner namely, Mridul Ghosh shall be released on

bail upon furnishing bond of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only) with two sureties of Rs.10,000/- each, one of whom must be local to the satisfaction of the learned Judge, Special Court, (under NDPS Act), Dakshin Dinajpur, Balurghat. If on bail, the petitioner shall meet with the investigating officer of the case once in a week till submission of the charge-sheet.

Accordingly, CRM (NDPS) 1411 of 2025 is allowed.
