1. The petitioners pray for expeditious disposal of the application filed in connection with Misc. Case No. 61 of 2009, which is pending before the learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 1<sup>st</sup> Court at Barasat, North 24 Parganas. The Misc. Case arose out of Title Suit No. 464 of 1991.
2. The prayer of the petitioners is innocuous. Neither party stands to lose if a proceeding is disposed of expeditiously. In fact, such expeditious disposal shall enure to the benefit of the parties. Hence, there is no requirement for service of prior notice upon the opposite parties.
3. Under such circumstances, this revisional application is disposed of with a request to the learned Court to dispose of the pending application within a period three months from the next date fixed. Adequate opportunity shall be granted to the parties to contest the same. Thereafter, the learned Court is requested to make

a sincere endeavour to dispose of the Misc. Case as expeditiously as possible.

4. This Court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the case. The learned Court shall proceed independently and in accordance with law.

5. A copy of the revisional application along with a server copy of this order be served upon the opposite parties and/or the learned advocate contesting the matter on behalf of the opposite parties in the learned court below, within a week.

6. Accordingly, this revisional application is disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.

7. Parties are to act on the server copy of this order.
