CRM (M) 2389 of 2025

In Re: An Application for Bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973/Under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Hariharpara Station Case No. 455 of 2023 dated 12.10.2023 under Sections 498A/302/304(b)/325/307/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner prays for bail on the grounds of the petitioner being detained in custody for two years one month. It has been submitted that only 6 witnesses have been examined out of the proposed 21 witnesses and there is no possibility of the trial concluding in near future. Other accused persons have been granted bail as has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner.

Learned advocate for the State on the other hand opposes the prayer for bail and draws the attention to the injury report as well as the post-mortem report. Learned advocate further submits that 8 witnesses have been examined out of the proposed 21 witnesses.

In view of the stage of the case, I direct the learned trial Court to conclude at least 10 more witnesses by 15th of May, 2026.

At this stage the prayer for bail of the petitioner being CRM (M) 2389 of 2025 is **rejected**.

No unnecessary adjournment be granted to any of the parties and the trial of the case would proceed in spite of the resolution of the local bar.

Petitioner would renew his prayer for bail after the aforesaid period is over.

Learned advocate for the State is directed to communicate this order to the learned trial Court.

Case Diary be returned to the learned advocate for the State.
