1. By this application, the petitioners seek expeditious disposal of Title Suit No.156 of 2013, which is pending before the learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 2nd Court at Barrackpore.
2. Considering the submissions, this Court is of the view that the prayer of the petitioners is innocuous. Neither party stands to lose if a proceeding is disposed of expeditiously. In fact, such expeditious disposal shall enure to the benefit of the parties. Hence, there is no requirement for service of prior notice upon the opposite parties.
3. Under such circumstances, the revisional application is disposed of with a direction upon the learned court to make the suit be ready for hearing and dispose of the same as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of two years from the next date fixed.
4. This court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of suit. The learned court shall proceed independently and in accordance with law.
5. The revisional application is accordingly disposed of.

6. A copy of the revisional application, along with a server copy of this order be served upon the opposite parties and/or the learned advocate contesting the matter on behalf of the opposite parties in the learned trial court.
7. There shall be no order as to costs.
8. Parties are to act on the server copy of this order.
