1. The petitioners pray for expeditious disposal of Title Suit No.70 of 2016, which is pending before the learned Civil Judge (Sr. Division), 1st Court, Tamruk, District- Purba Medinipur. It is submitted that the suit is at the stage of evidence.
2. The prayer of the petitioners is innocuous. Neither party stands to lose if a proceeding is disposed of expeditiously. In fact, such expeditious disposal shall enure to the benefit of the parties. Hence, there is no requirement for service of prior notice upon the opposite parties.
3. This revisional application is disposed of by requesting the learned Civil Judge (Sr. Division), 1st Court, Tamruk, District- Purba Medinipur to dispose of the Title Suit No.70 of 2016 upon giving adequate opportunity to all the contesting parties, but without granting any unnecessary adjournment to either of the parties, strictly in accordance with law, preferably within a period of

six months from the date of communication of this order.

4. This court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the suit. The learned court shall proceed independently and in accordance with law.
5. A copy of the revisional application along with a server copy of this order be served upon the opposite parties and/or the learned advocate contesting the matter on behalf of the opposite parties in the learned court below, within a week.
6. Affidavit-of-service to be filed before the Court below.
7. The revisional application is accordingly disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.
8. Parties are to act on the server copy of this order.
