Heard the learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

Considering the materials available in the case diary including the statements of witnesses and the injury report although I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, his movement needs to be restricted for a limited period.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure,

corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita on further condition that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever and the petitioner shall meet the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till submission of report in final form and shall stay outside the jurisdiction of Nayagram Police Station for a period of three months from this date except for the purpose of attending the jurisdictional Court or for meeting the Investigating Officer.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
