C.R.M. (NDPS) 1537 of 2025

In Re: An application for bail under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksh Sanhita, 2023 filed in connection with Sealdah G.R.P.S. Police Station Case No.10 of 2025 dated 31.01.2025 under Sections 20(b)(ii)(c)/ 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act;

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that from the joint possession of petitioner and another 20.887 kgs. of ganja were recovered. Petitioner is in custody for 11 months, investigation has been concluded and charges have been framed by the learned special court.

Learned advocate for the State opposes the prayer for bail.

Having considered the period of detention of the present petitioner, I am of the opinion that further detention of the petitioner is unwarranted.

Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is allowed. The petitioner namely, Sankar Mondal @ Rajib @ Shankar Mondal shall be released on bail upon furnishing bond of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only) with two sureties of

Rs.10,000/- each, one of whom must be local to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Sessions Judge, 4th Court, Alipore. If on bail, the petitioner shall not leave the jurisdiction of the district of 24 Parganas (South) and shall be physically present on each and every date fixed by the learned trial court.

Accordingly, CRM (NDPS) 1537 of 2025 is allowed.
