1. By this application, the petitioners seek expeditious disposal of Partition Suit No.58 of 2005 along with an application for addition of party, which are pending before the learned Civil Judge (Senior Division), 1st Court at Berhampore, Murshidabad.
2. Considering the submissions, this Court is of the view that the prayer of the petitioners is innocuous. Neither party stands to lose if a proceeding is disposed of expeditiously. In fact, such expeditious disposal shall enure to the benefit of the parties. Hence, there is no requirement for service of prior notice upon the opposite parties.
3. Under such circumstances, the revisional application is disposed of with a direction upon the learned court to dispose of the application as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of two months from the next date fixed. Thereafter, the learned court shall make sincere endeavour to dispose of the suit expeditiously. Adequate opportunity shall be given to the parties to contest the same.

4. This court has neither expressed any opinion on the merits of the application nor on the merits of the suit. The learned court shall proceed independently and in accordance with law.
5. The revisional application is accordingly disposed of.
6. There shall be no order as to costs.
7. Parties are to act on the server copy of this order.
