C.R.M. (DB) 4804 of 2023

In Re: An application for cancellation of bail under Section 439(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 483(3) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Berhampore Police Station Case No. 1097 of 2023 dated 05.08.2023 under sections 420/408/468/34 of the POCSO Act.

1. Private opposite parties were granted bail by the order dated August 7, 2023 by the Chief Judicial Magistrate.
 2. Police case is one of forgery.
 3. Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that amount involved is in excess of Rupees One crore and that forensic evidence establish that the signature of his client was forged on the document concerned.
 4. State is represented.
 5. Police filed charge-sheet.
 6. Police case is based primarily on documentary evidence. Need for cancellation of the bail to place the private opposite parties in custody is not felt.
- In any event, the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate

proceeded to view the offences as involving civil disputes.

7. In such circumstances, the order granting bail cannot be said to be perverse. We find no merit in the present application.
8. Accordingly, **C.R.M. (DB) 4804 of 2023** is dismissed.
