1. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned counsel for the State.
2. The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the issue pending before the West Bengal Administrative Tribunal (hereinafter referred to as the State Administrative Tribunal) is being adjourned repeatedly.
