Affidavit-of-service filed on behalf of the petitioner be kept with the record.

The husband of the petitioner was an approved Assistant Teacher of Primary School, who died-in-harness on March 08, 1999.

The Pension Payment Order of the employee concerned was issued on September 14, 2000 in pursuance whereof the petitioner received the gratuity and arrear pension on December 28, 2000.

In the instant writ petition the prayer of the petitioner is a writ of mandamus be issued commanding the respondents to pay interest on the said amount of gratuity and arrear pension for the delayed payment.

Learned advocate for the State-respondents does not oppose the prayer of the petitioner.

It is now well settled that the petitioner is entitled to the interest, as prayed for.

The respondents, the concerned Treasury Officer in particular are, therefore, directed to pay interest @ 8% per annum on the arrear amount of pension and gratuity from the date of death of the employee concerned till the date of such payment.

The payment as aforesaid shall be made within the period of eight weeks from the date of communication of this order, in default, the said arrear amount shall fetch an additional interest of 2% per annum.

W.P.A 1106 of 2025 stands disposed of with the above directions. There shall be no order as to costs.
