PER COURT :-

1. Heard both sides.
2. Applicants seek to condone delay of 3523 and 3572 days in their respective appeals for the reasons stated in the applications.

3. Learned AGPs oppose the applications.
4. The averments of the applications have not been controverted. I find no reasons to infer any malafides on the part of the applicants in preferring appeals belatedly. The delay stands condoned on condition that applicants shall not be entitled to the interest and statutory benefits for the delayed period.
