1. Issue notice to the respondents, returnable on 17.10.2025.

CIVIL APPLICATION NO. 10185 OF 2025

For the reasons stated in the application, execution and operation of the judgment and award dated 28.02.2025, passed by the learned District Judge-7 and Ex-officio Member of Motor Accident Claims Tribunal, Aurangabad, in M.A.C.P. No.615/2022 is stayed for a further period of eight weeks subject to deposit of entire award amount together with interest accrued thereon in this Court within eight weeks from today. If amount is not deposited within given time, stay granted stands automatically vacated.

3. Issue notice to the respondents, returnable on 17.10.2025.

4. The matter be listed after service of notice is complete. In the meantime, applicant shall take recourse to the provisions enumerated in Chapter II of the Bombay High Court Appellate Side Rules, corresponding to the stage and requirement of matter.
