

3. It appears that subsequently, the respondent No.2-Authority on an application filed before it, issued a corrigendum adding certain names and making corrections in the deemed conveyance granted in favour of the petitioner-society. The same was

challenged before this Court in Writ Petition No. 15754 of 2023. The said petition was allowed by an order dated 29th April 2024, by holding that the respondent No.2 does not have the power to make such corrections or to issue any corrigendum. In that light, the deemed conveyance certificate issued on the basis of the order dated 27th May 2025, stood revived.

4. The petitioner-society is before this Court in this petition with a specific prayer for the said order dated 27th May 2015 to be set aside and for liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh application before respondent No.2, which could be decided in accordance with law.

5. Issue notice, returnable on **1st August 2025**.

6. Mr. Nelson, learned AGP waives notice on behalf of respondent No.1 and 2.

7. The petitioner is permitted to serve respondent Nos.3 to 12 additionally by way of private service and to file an affidavit of service within two weeks from today.
