CONSENT TERMS

1. Amicable Settlement:

The Applicant and the Respondent state that, with the intervention of well-wishers and through their respective Advocates, they have voluntarily and amicably settled all disputes arising out of their matrimonial relationship. The settlement is arrived at of their own free will and volition, without any force, coercion, undue influence, or pressure.

2. Representation:

Both parties confirm that they are represented by Advocates before this Hon'ble Court, have fully understood the contents and legal implications of these Consent Terms, and are executing the same in sound mind.



3. Settlement Amount:

- a. The Respondent agrees to pay to the Applicant a total sum of ₹ 6, 00,000 /- (Rupees Six Lakh only) in full and final settlement of all her past, present, and future monetary and matrimonial claims.
- b. The said sum shall be paid in two equal instalments of ₹ 3,00,000 /- each, by Demand Drafts drawn in favour of the Applicant as under:
 - I. The parties have agreed that a sum of Rs. 3, 00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs only) shall be paid by the Respondent by Demand Draft on the day of, or before filing of, the petition for divorce by mutual consent.
 - II. (The parties have further agreed that an additional amount of Rs. 3, 00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs only) shall be paid by the Respondent by Demand Draft on or before the passing of the final decree of dissolution of marriage.
 - III. Upon receipt of the final instalment, the Applicant shall have no further claim, right, or demand of any nature whatsoever against the Respondent.

4. Withdrawal of Proceedings:

- a. The Respondent agrees to take all necessary steps for withdrawal of the present proceedings pending



before the Court of the 7th Joint C.J.S.D. and Addl. C.J.M., Pune, within the Period of 1 week from the date of execution of the present consent terms.

- b. Thereafter, both parties agree to jointly file a Petition for Divorce by Mutual Consent under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, before the competent Family Court at Vaduj within two weeks of withdrawal of the above said proceeding.
- c. The parties have agreed that they shall bear their own costs and expenses for filing and prosecuting the petition for dissolution of marriage by mutual consent under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
- d. Both parties undertake to co-operate in such proceedings and to appear before the Court to give their free consent for dissolution of marriage.

5. Mutual Declarations:

- a. This settlement is executed voluntarily, without any threat, inducement, or duress.
 - b. The parties agree that neither shall hereafter make any claim, allegation, or demand — monetary or otherwise — arising from their past cohabitation or matrimonial relationship.
 - c. Each party shall retain the articles, jewellery, and personal belongings presently in their possession, and neither shall raise any claim in respect thereof.
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6. Default / Breach Clause:

- a. If the Respondent fails to pay any instalment within the agreed schedule, the Applicant shall be entitled to revive the pending proceedings or to seek enforcement of these Consent Terms before this Hon'ble Court and file appropriate proceeding as entitled under the law for the time being enforced.
- b. If the Applicant, after receiving the settlement amount, fails to withdraw or co-operate in the filing of the Mutual Consent Petition as agreed, she shall refund the entire amount received within 30 days, failing which the Respondent may move this Hon'ble Court for appropriate reliefs.
- c. The parties have agreed that they shall abide by the terms and conditions stipulated herein, which shall be construed as an undertaking to the High Court, and any breach of the terms and conditions of the present settlement by any party shall attract proceedings under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.

7. Remedy Clause:

In case of any breach or non-compliance by either party, the aggrieved party shall have liberty to apply to this Hon'ble Court for suitable directions, including revival of the original proceedings.

8. Final Clause:

Both parties affirm that these Consent Terms are executed in good faith, constitute a complete and final settlement

between them, and may be taken on record and form part of the order of this Hon'ble Court.
