1. The present petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeks a Writ of Habeas Corpus in respect of Mr. Vishal Dinesh Patel.

2. The learned APP states that said Mr. Vishal Patel is an accused in Crime No.770 of 2024 registered with Sinhadgad Road Police Station, Pune under Section 75(2) of the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023 (for short "BNS"). On completion of the investigation, the charge-sheet was presented before the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate, First Class. For that purpose, the said Mr. Vishal Patel was summoned to attend before the learned Magistrate. On appearance of Mr. Vishal Patel he was taken in MCR as informed, on instructions, by the learned APP and since then, he has been in jail under the judicial order passed by the learned Magistrate.

3. The learned APP further states that Mr. Vishal Patel has filed an application for bail before the Sessions Court concerned and it is

pending hearing and disposal. These facts are conceded by the learned Advocate for the Petitioner and, therefore, on instructions, he seeks leave to withdraw this petition.

4. Leave to withdraw is granted.

5. At this stage, at the request of the learned Advocate for the Petitioner, the learned Judge of the Sessions Court is requested to expedite the hearing and disposal of the bail application, if any, filed by the Petitioner.

6. The Petition stands disposed of as withdrawn. No costs.
