By the present Application filed under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (“**BNSS**” for short), the Applicant is before this Court seeking regular bail in connection with F.I.R. No. 330 of 2024 registered with Yevat Police Station, Pune Rural for the offence punishable under Sections 123 and 223 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, (“**BNS**” for short) and Sections 26(2), 26(2)(a), 27(3)(d), 27(3)(e) and 59 of the Food Safety and Standard Act, 2006.
