- 3.** With the able assistance of learned APP I have perused the FIR. It is discernible that Applicant initially had a transaction of purchase of 10 mobile phones with the complainant. Complainant paid the amount of Rs. 5,90,000/- but the applicant did not give mobile phones to him. Thereafter, curiously the FIR proceeds further and states that after four months the applicant has given Rs. 49,07,534/- on 14th August, 2023 and Rs. 5,00,000/- on 16th August, 2023 by transferring the said amount in the account of the Applicant. Transaction in question is not understood *prima facie* as stated in the FIR and the Application also.
