1. This is an application for condonation of delay in filing the restoration application for restoration of writ petition of which registration was refused for non-removal of office objections.

2. Learned counsel for applicant submits that the delay occurred because the petitioner was not aware about refusal of registration and filed the application immediately after getting knowledge. He states that the delay is unintentional and needs to be condoned for allowing the petitioner to contest the petition on merits.

3. Considering the reasons mentioned and submissions advanced the delay of 168 days in filing the application is condoned subject to the applicant depositing cost of Rs. 2,500/-

with the High Court Bar Association Library within two weeks from today.
