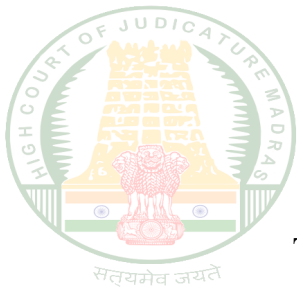

3. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the records.

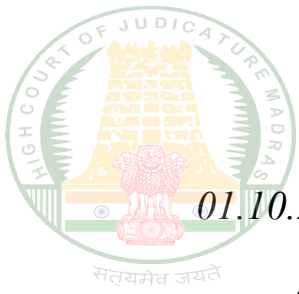
4. The adjudication of the learned Principal Family Court, Chennai in OP.No.2926 of 2024 is herein below extracted:-

5. A perusal of the above adjudication would indicate that the petitioner has rushed to this Court seeking an early disposal of the Original Petition when the counter itself has not been filed by the respondent and there does not appear to be any undue delay either on



the part of the respondent or on the part of the Court. The petitioner is seeking to jump the queue by getting orders from the this court for early disposal.
