ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 01.02.2025, seeking bail

in Crime No.48 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 274, 275, 123 of BNS, 2023 and Sections 6(b), 24(1) of COTPA, 2003 and Sections 7 and 9(ii) of TN Prohibition of Smoking and Spitting Act, 2003.

2.It is the case of the prosecution that the petitioner along with the other accused was found to be in illegal possession of 17.650 kgs of banned tobacco products. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and there is no previous case against the petitioner and that the material has been seized and the petitioner has been in custody from 01.02.2025 and hence, further custody of the petitioner is not required.

4.Per contra, the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the contraband has been seized and no previous case is pending against the petitioner.



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5. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) for the respondent Police and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the nature of allegations, period of incarceration and the fact that the contraband has been seized and no previous case is pending against the petitioner and since further custody of the petitioner is not required for the purpose of interrogation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **II Metropolitan Magistrate, Egmore, Chennai - 8**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, every day at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];***

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
