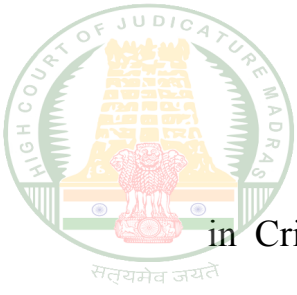
PRAYER: Criminal Original Petition filed under Section 483 of BNSS, pleaded to enlarge the petitioner on bail, in connection with the Crime No.33 of 2025, pending investigation on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 14.02.2025, seeking bail



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in Crime No.33 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 8(c),
22(b)(ii)(B), 29(1) of NDPS Act.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners were found in illegal possession of 1.150 kilograms of Ganja.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case and that the contraband has been seized.

4. Per contra, the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) reiterated the case of the prosecution and submitted that the contraband has been seized and that there is one previous case each against the petitioners.

5. Considering the period of incarceration, the fact that the contraband seized is intermediate quantity and since further custody of the petitioners are not required for the purpose of interrogation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.



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6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail on their executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **District Munsif cum Judicial Magistrate, Pallavaram**, and on further conditions that:

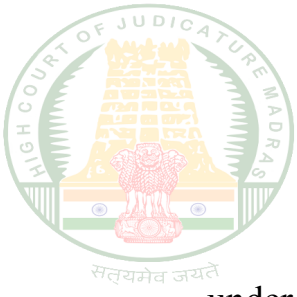
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioners shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]***;



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[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered
under Section 269 B.N.S.
