ORDER



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This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner / Accused-4, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 03.02.2025, seeking bail in Crime No.91 of 2025 registered for the offences under Sections 49 and 103 of B.N.S.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity between A1 and the deceased, who is the defacto complainant's brother, with regard to love affair with the petitioner/A4 herein, on 02.02.2023, A1 and A2 caught hold of the hands of the deceased and A3, on instructions of A1, cut the throat of the deceased, due to which, the deceased died on spot.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would contend that the petitioner has nothing to do with the offences as alleged by the prosecution; and that considering the period of incarceration of the petitioner, prayed that the petitioner may be granted bail.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the



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respondent police, while opposing for grant of bail to the petitioner, reiterated the prosecution case and on instructions submitted that, the petitioner has been implicated on the confession of A1 and that he has no bad antecedents.

5. Considering the aforesaid facts, the nature of allegations against the petitioner, considering the overt act attributed as against the petitioner, period of incarceration, the fact that the petitioner has no bad antecedents, she has been implicated on the confession of A1 and since further custody of the petitioner is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on her executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate - IV, Salem.**

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and



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Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]*;



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[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh
FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
