ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 03.03.2025, seeking bail in Crime No.8 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 417, 376(2)(n) of IPC.

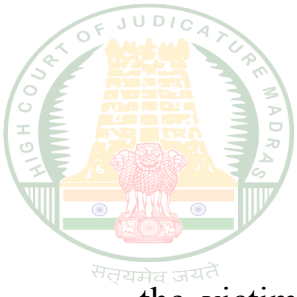
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2. The case of the prosecution is that, the petitioner and the victim girl are related to each other; that the petitioner on the promise of marriage, had sexual intercourse with the victim on five occasions and thereafter petitioner refused to marry her, due to which, victim attempted to commit suicide. Hence, the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the allegations are false; that even according to the case of the prosecution, petitioner and the victim were known to each other; that they had consensual relationship and in any case, the petitioner is in custody from 03.03.2025 and since further custody is not required, the petitioner may be released on bail.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) reiterated the prosecution case and confirmed the fact that the petitioner and the victim had consensual relationship.

5. Considering the nature of allegations against the petitioner; the period of incarceration; the fact that the relationship between the petitioner and

the victim was consensual and since further custody is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Polur, Tiruvannamalai.**

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]***;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
