ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 07.02.2025, seeking bail in Crime No.46 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 126(2), 296(b), 118(1) & 109 of BNS [under Section 147, 148, 341, 294(b), 324 and 307 of IPC].



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2. The case of the prosecution is that, there arose a wordy quarrel between the accused and the defacto complainant while consuming alcohol, as a result, petitioner along with other accused assaulted the defacto complainant with knife. Hence, the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the allegations are false and in any case, the petitioner is in custody from 07.02.2025 and since further custody is not required, the petitioner may be released on bail.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital. He further submitted that the petitioner has similar previous cases.

5. Considering the nature of allegations against the petitioner; the fact that the injured victim has been discharged from the hospital; the period of incarceration; and since further custody is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.



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6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Ambattur.**

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on



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bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]***;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
