ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who
was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 24.02.2025, seeking bail in
Crime No.61 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 8(c) r/w
20(b)(ii)(A) of NDPS Act, 1985 and Section 77 of Juvenile Justice (Care and



Protection of Children) Act 2015.

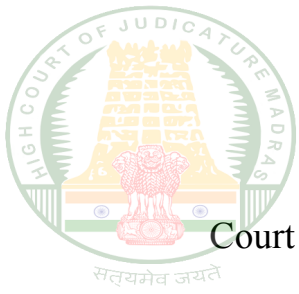
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2. The case of the prosecution is that petitioner was found in illegal possession of 150 grams of Ganja.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case and the petitioner is in custody from 24.02.2025 that in any case, further custody of the petitioner is not required and prayed for the grant of bail to the petitioner.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police, reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that there are 11 previous cases pending against the petitioner, out of which 10 cases were registered for IPC offences.

5. Considering the nature of allegations, period of incarceration, the fact that the contraband seized was a smaller quantity and since further custody of the petitioner is not required for the purpose of investigation, this



Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

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6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Salem**, and on further conditions that:

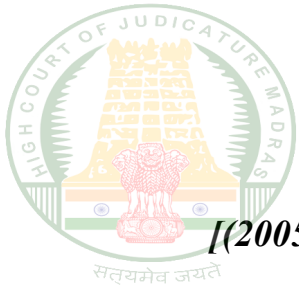
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala***

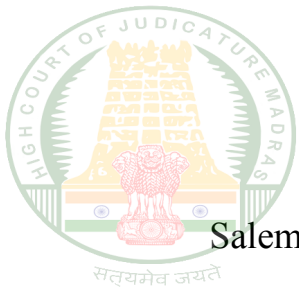
