**PRAYER:** Criminal Original Petition filed under Section 483 of BNSS, pleaded to enlarge the petitioner on bail, in connection with the Crime No.70 of 2025 pending investigation on the file of the respondent Police.

**ORDER**

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 01.03.2025 seeking bail in Crime No.70 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 8(c) r/w 20(b)(ii)(B), 22(b), 25 & 29(1) of the NDPS Act, 1985.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner/A3 along with other accused was found in joint possession of 8.750 kilograms of ganja and 10 grams of Methamphetamine. Hence, the case.

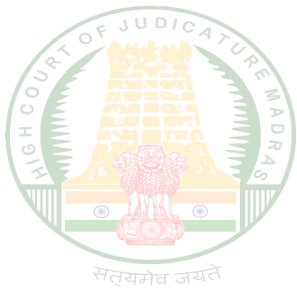


3.Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case; that the contraband was seized and that the petitioner is in custody from 01.03.2025 and hence, he may be released on bail.

4.Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police while opposing the grant of bail to the petitioner, reiterated the prosecution case and on instructions submitted that the contraband has been seized from the petitioner and that the petitioner has two previous cases out of which, one case is similar in nature.

5.Considering the period of incarceration and the fact that the petitioner is on bail in all the previous cases and the contraband totally seized is an intermediate quantity and since further custody is not required for the purpose of interrogation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties, (one surety must be a blood relative of the petitioner)**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Special Judge, Exclusive Trial of NDPS Act Cases at Coimbatore.**

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

**[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday Morning at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;**

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]***;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
