ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 10.03.2025, seeking bail in Crime No.127 of 2025 registered for the offence under section 24(1) of Cigarette and other Tobacco Products Act, 2003, under Sections 123 of BNS 2023 [328 of IPC] and Section 77 of Juvenile Justice [Care and Protection of Children) Act.

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2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with other accused was found to be illegal possession of 81 kgs of banned tobacco products. Hence, the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is in custody from 10.03.2025 and since the contraband has been seized, the petitioner may be released on bail.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) reiterated the case of the prosecution and submitted that the petitioner has one previous case and in that case, he is on bail.

5. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) for the respondent Police and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering, the fact that the contraband has been seized; period of incarceration; the fact that the petitioner is on bail in other case; and since further custody is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to

grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate No.II, Coimbatore**.

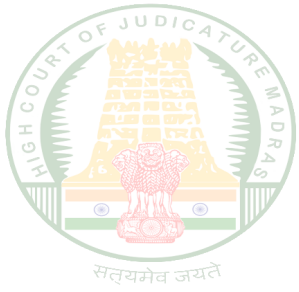
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala***
