**PRAYER:** This criminal original petition has been filed under Section 483 of BNSS to enlarge the petitioner on bail in Crime No.144 of 2025 pending investigation on the file of the respondent police.

**ORDER**

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 29.03.2025, seeking bail



in Crime No.144 of 2025 registered for the offence under Sections 309(4) @  
Section 310(4) of BNS, 2023.

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2.It is the case of the prosecution that the defacto complainant was returning home in a bus from Andhra Pradesh; that when the bus stopped at Balaji Aryas Hotel, Parikal, the petitioner along with the other accused entered into the bus and demanded his bag which contained 1 gram gold coin, Rs.3,200 cash, ATM card, Hard Disc, Driving License and RC book; that when the defacto complainant refused the same, the accused had snatched the bag at knife point. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent; and that the petitioner is in custody from 29.03.2025 and hence, further custody of the petitioner is not required and sought for bail.

4.Per contra, the learned Government Advocate (CrI. Side) reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that there is a previous case pending against the petitioner and he is on bail in that case and that as on date, cash of Rs.2,500/- was recovered from the accused.



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5. Heard the learned counsel on either side and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the nature of allegations, period of incarceration, the fact that the petitioner is on bail in the previous case and since further custody of the petitioner is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **Judicial Magistrate No.II, Ulundurpet**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;



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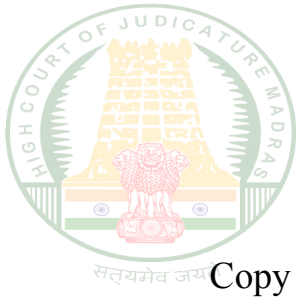
[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]***;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
