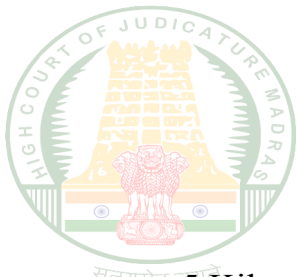

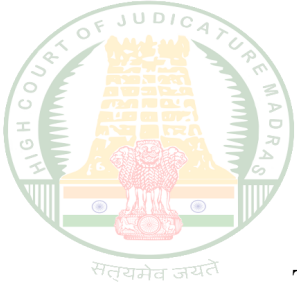

2.In view of the above submission made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Writ Petition is dismissed as infructuous. No costs.

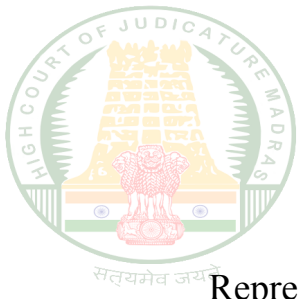
