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### **ORDER**

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 126(2), 296(b), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS, 2023, in Crime No.160 of 2025 seek anticipatory bail.

2.It is the case of the prosecution that due to wordy quarrel with regard to money dispute, the petitioner along with the other accused abused the defacto complainant in filthy language, threatened him of dire consequences and assaulted him with wooden logs and caused injuries to him. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He would further submit that the injured has been discharged from the hospital. He would further submit that the petitioners are ready to abide by any stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court and sought for anticipatory bail.



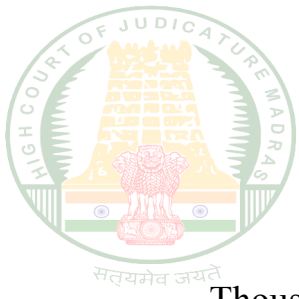
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4.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital. However, he opposed for the grant of anticipatory bail.

5.Heard both side and perused the materials available on record.

6.Considering the nature of allegations, the fact that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and since custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not required, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions:

7.Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned **VIII Metropolitan Magistrate Court- George Town**, on condition that the petitioners shall execute separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000 (Rupees Ten



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Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the first petitioner shall report before the respondent Police at daily at 10:30 A.M for a period of two months and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation and the second petitioner shall report before the respondent Police as and when required for interrogation;

[c] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and



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the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]*;

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
