ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 23.05.2025, for the offences punishable under Section 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 311 and 351(3) of BNS, 2023 in connection with Crime No.752 of 2025, registered on the file of the respondent, seeks bail.



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2.The learned counsel for the petitioner even before commencing his arguments submitted that the name of the petitioner has been wrongly spelt in the petition and affidavit as “Deniel” instead of “Denial”. The said submission made by the learned counsel for petitioner is taken on record and accordingly, this Court proceeds further without hinging on technicalities.

3. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner waylaid the de-facto complainant and robbed sum of Rs.500/-. Hence, the case.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he is no way connected with the alleged offence. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent conditions that may be imposed by this Court and he prays for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. Learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police, while opposing for grant of bail to the petitioner, reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the petitioner has got 13 previous cases, in fact, the petitioner is a history sheeter in H.S.No.3/2020 and the last case was on 18.06.2024.



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6. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

7. Considering the submissions made by the learned counsels on either side and the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

8. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Thiruvottiur**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] **the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of three weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation;**



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[c] the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;

[d] the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly cause any threat to the de-facto complainant and witnesses;

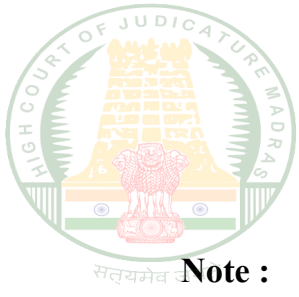
[e] the petitioner to give an undertaking that if required for being identified by witnesses during investigation or for police custody beyond the first fifteen days, he shall comply to the directions as may be given by the Court in this regard;

[f] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
