PRAYER

The writ petition has been filed to direct the respondents to notionally regularize the petitioners service by relaxing the rules after completion of ten years from the date of initial appointment as a Pot Watcher on a daily wage basis. This regularization is sought for the purpose of getting pension and family pension.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners have sent a common representation dated 04.03.2025 seeking notional regularisation and the representation is yet to be considered by the respondents.

3. At this juncture, the learned Central Government Standing Counsel appearing on behalf of the 1st respondent would fairly submit that they would consider the petitioners common representation within a reasonable time.

4. In such view of the matter, without going into the merits of the writ



petition, this Court deems it appropriate to direct the respondents to consider the petitioners common representation and pass orders within a period of eight (8) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, based on its own merits and in accordance with law.

5. With the above directions, this Writ Petition stands disposed of. No costs.
