ORDER

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the



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respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS Act in Crime No.275 of 2025, on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that there was a pathway dispute between the petitioners and the defacto complainant, due to which the petitioners abused and attacked the defacto complainant using stones. Thereby, the defacto complainant was sustained grievous injuries and got admitted in the Hospital. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not required and sought for anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4.The learned Government Advocate(Crl.Side) reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that A1 has four previous cases against him and the injured has been discharged from the hospital and vehemently opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



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5.Considering the above fact and circumstances of the case and since custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not required, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners 2 and 3 with certain conditions and insofar as the first petitioner is concerned the anticipatory bail application stands dismissed.

6.Accordingly, the petitioners 2 and 3 are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, before the learned Court of Judicial Magistrate Court No.II, Arakkonam Ranipet District, on condition that the petitioners 2 and 3 shall execute a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with **two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioners 2 and 3 and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure



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their identity.

[b] the petitioners 2 and 3 shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation;

[c] the petitioners 2 and 3 shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners 2 and 3 shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners 2 and 3 in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners 2 and 3 released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
