Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying to issue a Writ of Mandamus, directing the Respondent to pay the petitioner interest at the rate of 15% per annum for the belated payment of 653 days in paying his PF, Gratuity, Earned Leave and Surrender leave salary with interest at the rate of 15% within a specified time, as may be fixed by this Court.

### **ORDER**

By consent of both the learned counsel for the parties, the Writ Petition is taken up for final disposal, at the admission stage itself.

2. The instant writ petition has been filed with a prayer for issuing a Mandamus, directing the Respondent to pay the petitioner interest at the rate of 15% per annum for the belated payment of 653 days in paying his PF, Gratuity, Earned Leave and Surrender leave salary with interest at the rate of 15% within a specified time, as may be fixed by this Court.

3. Heard the learned counsel for both sides and perused the materials available on record.



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4. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner has joined in the services of the Respondent-Transport Corporation as Conductor on 01.01.1997 and after rendering 26 years of service, he retired from service on 30.04.2023 as Special Grade Conductor. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that though he retired from service during 2023, his terminal benefits were settled only on 12.02.2025, after a delay of 653 days. But for the such delay, the respondent did not pay any interest. It is the submission of the petitioner that he is entitled for interest at the rate of 15% per annum upon the belated payment of terminal benefits. Hence, claiming interest for the delayed payment, the petitioner has sent a representation dated 17.02.2025 to the respondent. Since the same was not considered by the respondent, the present Writ Petition has been filed.

5. At this juncture, the learned Standing Counsel appearing for the respondent would fairly submit that in view of the similar orders passed by this Court in W.P.Nos. 40031, 33742 and 35806 of 2024, they are willing to pay the interest at the rate of 6% per annum for the belated payment of the eligible and admissible amount.



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6. In view of the above submission of the learned Standing Counsel, this Court deems it appropriate to direct the respondent to pay the interest at the rate of 6% per annum upon the delayed payment of retirements benefits, from the date of retirement till the date of actual disbursal of the terminal benefits to the petitioner, within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order.

7. With the above direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of. No costs.
