ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on
01.07.2025, for the offence punishable under Section 75 (2), 78 (2) BNS,
Section 67 A, 66 E of I.T Act and Section 4 of TNPHW Act, 2002, in Crime
No.31 of 2025, registered on the file of the respondent, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner and the defacto-complainant are working in the same company and they were in relationship for some period. Thereafter, they ended their relationship. During their relationship, the petitioner had taken some photos and videos together. Using this, the petitioner threatened the defacto-complainant. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner never threatened or uploaded any photos or videos of the defacto-complainant. He further submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody from 01.07.2025 and hence, further custody of the petitioner is not required. Hence, he prayed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the petitioner's phone was seized and it is seen that he has not forwarded any of the photos or videos.

5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.



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6.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, submissions made by the learned counsels on either side and the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Ambattur**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] **the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police daily at 10.30 a.m for a period of three weeks; thereafter as and when required for interrogation;**

[c] the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;

[d] the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly

cause any threat to the de facto complainant and witnesses;

[e] the petitioner to give an undertaking that if required for being identified by witnesses during investigation or for police custody beyond the first fifteen days, he shall comply to the directions as may be given by the Court in this regard;

[f] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
