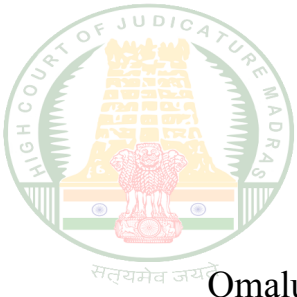

3. I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and I have also perused the materials placed on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner/wife submits that, initially the respondent/husband has filed a divorce petition in HMOP.No.105 of 2019 before the Family Court, Dharmapuri and the petitioner/wife has filed a Domestic Violence complaint as against the respondent in DVC.No.20 of 2019 before the Additional Mahila Court, Salem and subsequently, both the cases were transferred to the file of the Sub Court, Omalur, pursuant to the order of this Court dated 20.12.2019 and the above said cases were renumbered as HMOP.No.70 of 2021 and DVC.No.1 of 2024 respectively. Though the above said cases were filed as early as in the year 2019, till date, the said cases have not been disposed of and the same are pending for the past seven years. Hence, these revision petitions.
