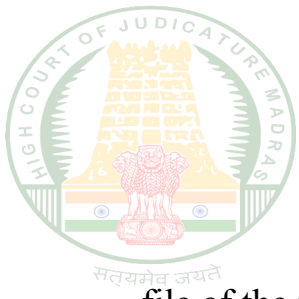

ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 08.07.2025, for the offence punishable under Sections 3(2)(a), 4(1), 5(1) of Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act 1956 registered in Crime No.24 of 2025 on the

file of the respondent, seeks bail.

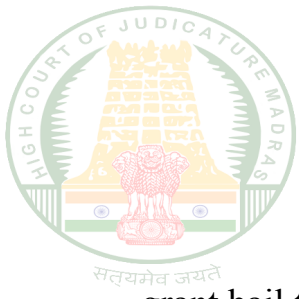
2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with other accused indulged in prostitution by engaging girls. Accordingly, he was arrested. Hence, the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He also submitted that the petitioner is in no way connected with the alleged offence, however, he is suffering incarceration from 08.07.2025. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he prayed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) appearing for the respondent police, submitted that the petitioner along with other accused indulged in prostitution by engaging girls and the petitioner was arrested. He also submitted that no previous case is pending against the petitioner. However, he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of allegations, submissions made by the learned counsels on either side, considering the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to

grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his/her executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only)** **with two sureties for a like sum, one surety shall be local surety. One surety shall be family member of the Accused** to the satisfaction of the learned **IV Metropolitan Magistrate/IV Judicial Magistrate, Saidapet, Chennai District** and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am., for a period of three weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

[c] The petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;

[d] the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly cause any threat to the de facto complainant and witnesses;

[e] the petitioner to give an undertaking that if required for being identified by witnesses during investigation

or for police custody beyond the first fifteen days, she shall comply to the directions as may be given by the Court in this regard;

[f] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
