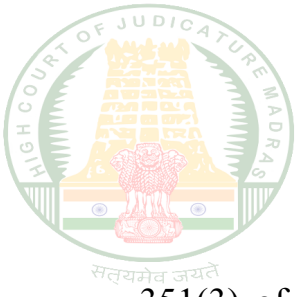

ORDER

The petitioner herein apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 311, &



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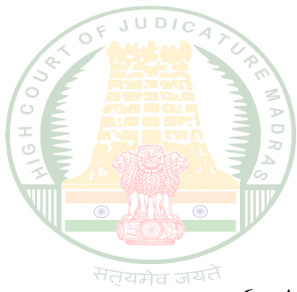
351(3) of BNS, 2023, in Crime No.121 of 2025, on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner, along with others, snatched Rs.750/- from the defacto complainant's pocket at knife point when he was returning home. Hence, the case.

3. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police submitted that petitioner has six previous cases. In this case, this petitioner along with other accused by name Vijay robbed Rs.750/- from the defacto complainant. Hence, he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. Heard the learned counsels on either side and perused the materials available on record.

5. On perusal of the First Information Report, this Court does not find involvement of any person other than Vijay. Hence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner subject to certain conditions.



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6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, **on or before 28.08.2025** before the learned **Judicial Magistrate Court, Ambattur**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** **with two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a] **if the petitioner fails to surrender before the said Magistrate on or before 28.08.2025, this Order shall stand automatically cancelled;**

[b] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[c] **the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30.a.m., until further orders;**

[d] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned

[e] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
