ORDER

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The petitioner, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 296(B), 115(2), 118(1), 351(3) of BNS, 2023 read with Section 3(1) of TN Public Property Act, 1992, in Crime No.256 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity, the petitioner being employee along with other accused alleged to have assaulted the defacto complainant who is their manager and caused injury on abusement and criminal intimidation in addition to causing mischief to the property worth about Rs.3,00,000/- in total. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would contend that the petitioner is innocent and has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution, hence prayed for anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

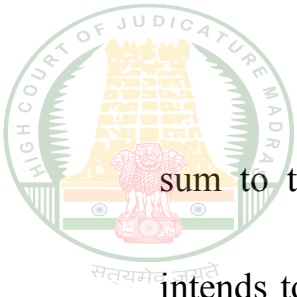


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4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) appearing for the respondent police submitted that the petitioner is arrayed as A6 in this case and due to previous enmity, the petitioner being employee along with other accused alleged to have assaulted the defacto complainant who is their manager and caused injury on abusement and criminal intimidation in addition to causing mischief to the property worth about Rs.3,00,000/-. Hence, he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking note of the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of allegations and since, custodial interrogation is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order before the ***learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Tiruppur***, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only)**, with two sureties, each for a like



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sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

- (a) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;
- (b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on every Sunday at 10.30 a.m. for the period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.**
- (c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;
- (d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;
- (e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions



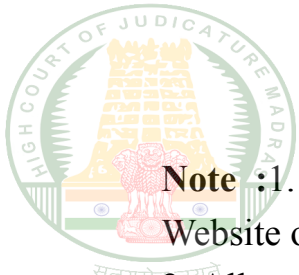
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have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]*; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
