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## **ORDER**

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The petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 13.07.2025, for the offence Girl Missing and altered to Section 87 of BNS Act in Crime No.232 of 2025, registered on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner kidnapped the victim girl aged about 13 years and kept her in an unknown place for two days. Hence a case was registered by the respondent police.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that this is the case of abduction and the victim girl is also secured and the petitioner is in judicial custody from 13.07.2025. Hence, prays to grant bail to the petitioner.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent while opposing the bail to the petitioner, reiterated the prosecution case and submitted this the case of kidnapping and now the victim girl was secured. He further submitted that the petitioner's brother has abducted one another victim girl.



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5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the period of incarceration undergone by the Petitioner and the fact that the victim girl was secured, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner herein with certain conditions.

6.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on their executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties each** for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Ambattur and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] **the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.**

[c] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance



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with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;

[d] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
