ORDER

The petitioners were arrested and remanded to judicial custody on
20.07.2025, for the offence punishable under Sections 191(2), 191(3),
296(b), 103(1) of BNS, in Crime No.433 of 2025, registered on the file of the
respondent, seeks bail.



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2. The case of the prosecution is that, due to previous enmity, there were frequent quarrels between the deceased and one of the co-accused. One the date of occurrence, the petitioners along with other accused attacked the deceased with deadly weapons, and murdered the de facto complainant's husband. Hence, the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are an innocent person and have been falsely implicated in this case based on the confession of the co-accused. He further submitted that major part of the investigation is completed, and the petitioners were in custody from 20.07.2025. Hence, he prayed for grant of bail to the petitioners.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police opposed the grant of bail, reiterating the prosecution case and submitted that the petitioners along with other accused attacked him using knife and iron rod; that thereby the de facto complainant's husband died.



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5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the overt act against the petitioners, the period of incarceration, and one of the co-accused was granted bail by this Court in Crl.O.P.No.26546 of 2025 dated 25.09.2025, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners with certain conditions:

7. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail on their executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Vridhachalam**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioners shall stay at **Coimbatore** and report before the **Inspector of Police, Coimbatore Town Police Station** daily at **10.30 a.m.**, until further orders. It is made clear that the petitioners shall not



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enter into the jurisdictional limit of the respondent police, until further orders;

[c] the petitioners shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;

[d] the petitioners shall not directly or indirectly cause any threat to the de facto complainant and witnesses;

[e] the petitioners to give an undertaking that if required for being identified by witnesses during investigation or for police custody beyond the first fifteen days, he shall comply to the directions as may be given by the Court in this regard;

[f] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
