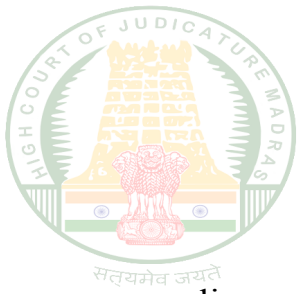
PRAYER: Criminal Original Petition filed under Section 482 of BNSS, to enlarge the petitioner on bail in the event of arrest in Crime No.555 of 2025 on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 4(1)(A) of TNP (Amendment) Act and 24 of TNP Act in Crime No.555 of 2025, on the file of the respondent



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police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The petitioner is arrayed as A1 and he is the owner of TASMAC Bar attached to the TASMAC shop No.1564, Lakshmi Nagar, Saravanampatti Coimbatore. The case of the prosecution is that, the accused persons, viz., A2 to A4 had sold liquor bottles of various brands in front of the said TASMAC shop against the rules. Hence, the complaint has been registered.

3.Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has no knowledge about the selling of liquor bottles by A2 to A4 and they are the suppliers of the said bar. He further submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case; and that the petitioner is ready to produce solvent sureties and to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court and also undertake to appear and to co-operate for the investigation. He further submitted that the petitioner, without prejudice to his rights, is ready to deposit some amount to any welfare scheme of the Government or any other organization and prayed for anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4.Learned Government Advocate (Cr1. Side) appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. He further submitted that the liquor bottles have been seized.



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5. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Cr1. Side) appearing for the respondent police and perused the materials available on record.

6. Taking note of the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of allegations, submissions made by the learned counsels on either side, and since, custodial interrogation is not required for the purpose of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before **the learned Judicial Magistrate-II, Coimbatore** on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only)** with **two sureties each** for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate/Judge concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and



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the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

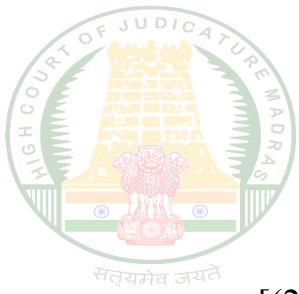
[b] the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of **Rs.10,000/-** (Rupees ten thousand only) as non-refundable deposit either through RTGS/NEFT/cash/demand draft in favour of the **Dean, Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai, bearing A/c. No.10273425961, State Bank of India, Park Town (Chennai), 68, Evening Bazaar Road, Chennai, IFSC:SBIN0001856**, without prejudice to his defence before the trial Court and the learned Judicial Magistrate, after perusing the challan/receipt, shall accept the sureties furnished by the petitioner;

[c] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders.

[d]the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e]the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala



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[(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g]If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
