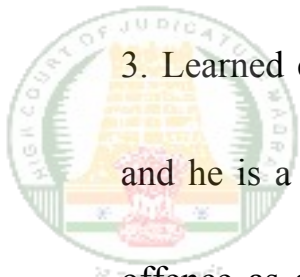

ORDER

The petitioner apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Section 465, 467, 468, 471 and 420 of IPC in Crime No.48 of 2014, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner by fabricating the documents, grabbed the property belonging to the defacto complainant. Hence, the complaint.



3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is a

and he is a Power of Attorney to the accused/A2 and the petitioner has not committed any

offence as alleged by the prosecution and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He

further submitted that the petitioner has no previous case with respect to cheating and is ready

to produce solvent sureties and also to abide with any conditions that may be imposed by this

Court, therefore, he prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent police opposed for

grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner stating that the petitioner with other accused

fabricated the documents and grabbed the property belonging to the defacto complainant. He

further submitted that the case is of the year 2014 and the investigation is still pending.

5. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side)

appearing for the respondent police and perused the materials available on record including

the FIR.

6. Taking note of the facts and circumstances of the case, the submissions made by the

learned counsel on either side and considering the nature of offence, custodial interrogation is

not necessary. Therefore, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with

certain conditions.



7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **Hon'ble Special Court for CCB and CBCID Cases at Egmore, Chennai** on

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condition that the petitioner shall execute a separate bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each** for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

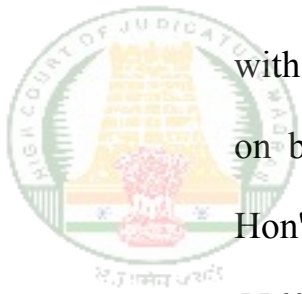
[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police every Saturday at 10.30 a.m. for a period of two(2) weeks.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial

Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance



with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

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[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
