ORDER

The petitioner, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 406, 420, 506(1) of IPC in Crime No.812 of 2022, seeks anticipatory bail.



2.The allegation against petitioner is that the petitioner along with other accused had received a huge amount of Rs.44 lakhs from the de-facto complainant under the guise of “getting job” and thereafter, the petitioner along with other accused had cheated the de-facto complainant. Hence the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has not commit any offence as alleged by the defacto complainant and it is only a loan transaction and she has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the co-accused has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court in Crl.OP.No.8176 of 2023 vide order dated 17.05.2023. Therefore, he prayed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) for the respondent submitted that on the promise of getting job to the defacto complainant, the petitioner along with other accused collected huge amount from the defacto complainant and they neither secured any job nor returned the money to him. Hence, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, co-accused has already been granted bail by this Court and also considering that the petitioner being a lady and major allegation made only against other accused, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain



conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order before the *learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Poonamallee*, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only), with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, everyday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of three weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation;

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005)*

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
