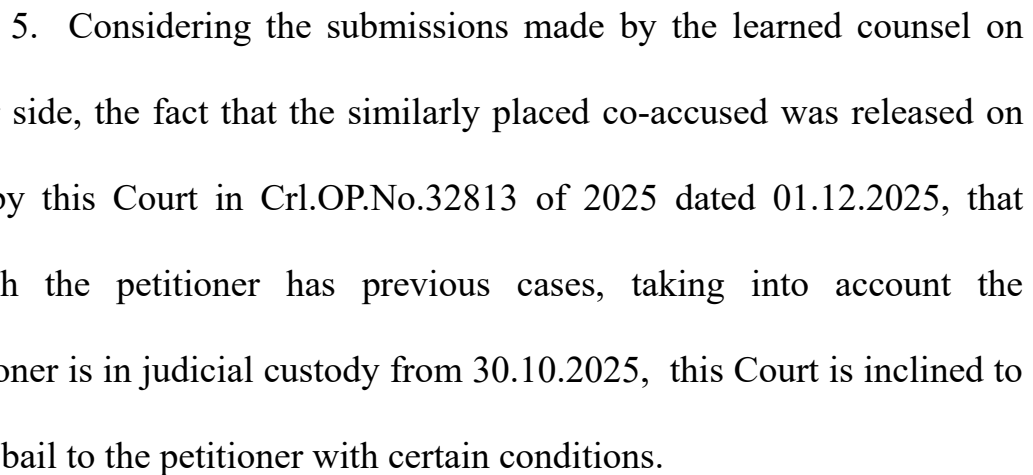
ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 30.10.2025 for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2), 125, 311 and 351(3) of BNSs, 2023 in Crime No.731 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner joined hands with other accused involved in robbery of Rs.600/- at knife point, hence, a complaint was lodged and the petitioner was arrested.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case, since he has got some previous cases. He further submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody since 30.10.2025 and that similarly placed co-accused was released on bail by this Court. Hence, he prayed to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that there are totally two accused in this case and the petitioner is ranked as A1. He further submitted that the petitioner has seven previous cases pending against him. Hence, he opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.



6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only)** with two sureties, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the *learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Salem, Poonamallee*, and on further conditions that:-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall stay at Vellore and report before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Vellore, daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of four weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.



[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself, as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
