ORDER

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest in the hands of the respondent
police for the offences punishable under Section 304(2) of BNS in connection
with the Cr.No.624 of 2025, seeks anticipatory bail.



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2. The case of the of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant was entering his vehicle after playing cricket near Coimbatore International Airport, three unknown persons pushed him down and hijacked his car. Hence, the case has been registered against the petitioner.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He submitted that he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He also submitted that the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court and ready to furnish sufficient solvent sureties for her release. Hence, he prays for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate [Criminal Side] reiterated the prosecution case, and submitted that the property has been recovered. He further submitted that there are fourteen previous cases pending against the petitioner. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the Petitioner.

5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.



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6. Considering the submissions made by learned counsels on either side and considering the nature of offence, already all the properties were recovered and the fact that there are fourteen previous cases, in all cases he was granted bail, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate Court No.2, Coimbatore**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders.

[b] the petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;

[c] the petitioner shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court;



[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 B.N.S.2023.
