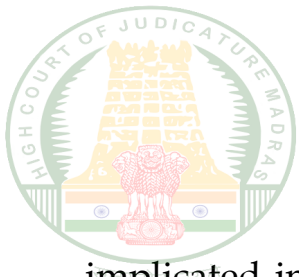

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioner on 25.02.2025 under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023 praying to grant an order of pre-arrest bail.

2. The petitioner/Accused No.3 apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent-Police for the offences punishable under Section 303(2) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 and Section 21(1) of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, in Crime No.373 of 2024 on the file of the respondent-police.

3. The case of the prosecution is that based on the secret information, on 26.12.2024, at about 5.00 a.m., when the defacto complainant, Village Administrative Officer, Alangulam, along with his team and police were conducting vehicle check-up on Alangulam to Panaikulam Road, near Nadarvalasai Wine Shop, they found that the petitioner and other accused persons were illegally transporting of ½ unit of sand (savudu sand) in an unnumbered tractor. On seeing the police, the petitioner fled from the place of occurrence leaving the tractor. The tractor, along with sand, was seized by the police. Hence, this case.

4. Mr.S.Suresh Kumar, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner, submits that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submits that the petitioner has been falsely



implicated in this case. He further submits that the petitioner has no previous case.

He further submits that the petitioner is a first year college student studying B.Sc.-C.S (Cyber security) in VELS Institute of Science, Technology and Advanced Studies, Pallavaram, Chennai. He however submits that the petitioner is ready to abide by the conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he prays for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner.

5. Mr.S.S.Manoj, the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent-Police, submits that the petitioner, along with other accused persons, was illegally transporting $\frac{1}{2}$ unit of sand (savadu sand). He further submits that the vehicle, along with sand, was seized by the respondent-police. However, he prays to dismiss this Criminal Original Petition.

6. Heard on both sides. This Court has perused the records.

7. The petitioner has permanent residence and hence, there is less possibility of absconding. The petitioner has no previous case. Considering the same, the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the offence allegedly committed by the petitioner, the fact that the petitioner is a first offender, and he is a first year college student studying B.Sc.-C.S (Cyber security) in VELS Institute of Science, Technology and Advanced Studies, Pallavaram, Chennai and with a view to give an opportunity to the petitioner to reform himself, this Court is inclined to grant an order of pre-



arrest bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:

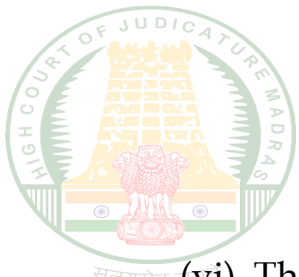
(i) The petitioner shall be released on bail in the event of his arrest or in the event of his surrender before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ramanathapuram, within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) along with two sureties each for a like sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ramanathapuram;

(ii) Thereafter, the petitioner shall cooperate with the Investigating Agency and shall appear before the respondent-police, as and when his presence is required for investigation;

(iii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the Application for Suretyship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ramanathapuram, shall obtain a copy of any one of identity proofs to ensure their identity;

(iv) The petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ramanathapuram;

(v) The petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;

(vi) The petitioner shall not leave India without previous permission of the

(vii) The petitioner shall not enter into the house or work place of the defacto complainant;

(ix) The petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, cause any threat to the defacto-complainant and witnesses and shall not tamper the evidence; and

(x) On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ramanathapuram, or Trial Court as the case may be, is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions are imposed by him as laid down by the Hon-ble Supreme Court in P.K. Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005) 13 SCC 283].

8. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed subject to the conditions stated supra.
