PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Cr.No.580 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police.



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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioner/Accused No.2, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under section 61(2), 126(2), 296(b), 318 (4), 329(4), 336(3), 339, 351(3) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 and Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 2002 in Crime No.580 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the signature of the defacto complainant's husband was forged and she was informed by her husband that on 02.09.2024, one Jeyakumar and five known persons had abducted her husband and obtained his signature at knife point. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner was working as Manager at Sundaram Finance and on 19.10.2022, he had submitted his resignation to Sundaram Finance Limited which was accepted by the said Company and he was relieved on 13.01.2023. The petitioner has nothing to do with the allegation of forging the signature of the husband of the defacto complainant and he has has been roped as accused as he was working as Manager in the Sundaram Finance Company at the relevant point of time. Hence, he prayed for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4.The learned Government Advocate(Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent



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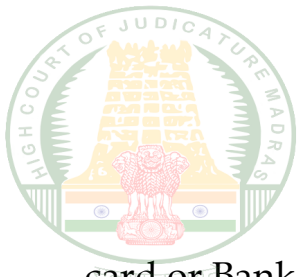
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police submits that totally there are two accused in this case. The petitioner is arrayed as Accused No.2. Investigation is going on for verifying the documents and signature. He had further submitted that the first accused was arrested and released on bail.

5. Considering the fact that the first accused was arrested and released on bail and due to civil dispute, the suit has been filed by the first accused in O.S.No.220 of 2023 on the file of the District Court, Trichy seeking a relief of specific performance, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions:

6. The petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.V, Tiruchirappalli, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar



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card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

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[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on every Monday and Friday at 10.30 a.m until further orders.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS 2023.
